2.2 SCHOOL DETAILS

Use of Welsh:

The Curriculum – All pupils at the FP gain experience of the learning fields through the medium of Welsh. The main teaching medium at KS2 is Welsh and at least 70% of the teaching is done in Welsh. English is formally introduced as a subject at KS2, and is taught through the medium of English, and English may be used for particular aspects of certain subjects.

School Language medium – Welsh is the school's language medium from day to day. Communication with pupils and in the school's administration is through the medium of Welsh. The school communicates with parents in both languages. The pupils are encouraged to speak the language both within and outside the school premises and there is a commitment to the LEA's Language Charter.

The Results – As a rule, it is expected that pupils, irrespective of the language spoken at home, can easily transfer to Welsh-medium secondary provision and that by the end of KS2, will have reached the same standard in English as pupils who are mainly English medium.

Latecomers

For a learner admitted to the Junior Department, the aim is that the new language be introduced as soon as they have settled down at the school. The initial emphasis is on the verbal aspect, and once the language has satisfactorily developed, a start is made on the other language skills. Latecomers can attend Maesincla Catchment-area Language Unit where there are facilities available to present learner specialist intensive courses.

When comparing results against targets, a few changes are apparent due to:

- Guidance disseminated by GWE regarding levels – 51% achieve the higher level.
- This year, 3/4/5 Level assessment sheet was used on the front cover of pupils books and this was seen as good practice for assessment and planning of tasks to enable pupils to reach their maximum potential.
- Moderation meetings held with Ysgol Uwchradd Brynrefail and other schools within the catchment-area has raised levels of Y5 and 6 pupils.

SCHOOL IMPLEMENTED SCHEMES:

Webster Straton Scheme

The above scheme strategies are implemented in all classes. The scheme objective is to improve young people emotionally, and increase pupils understanding of emotions and feelings.

School Council

2 representatives, a boy and girl, are elected from every year in the JUNIOR Department. The Council is required to hold 6 meetings within the school year, 1 meeting every half term. Regular meetings have been held led by Lisa Williams. There is non-contact time for these meetings and during the year, the School Council discussed several issues of importance to them and organized several activities such as:

- **Children in Need** –The School Council organized a fun day to fund-raise towards a Children in Need campaign. Every child was dressed up as Pudsey / or in yellow and £150.00 raised towards the cause. Decorated Pudsey biscuits were prepared and Pudsey ear-rings and bracelets were sold.
- **Traditional Games Day** – On the first Friday in January, the pupils were asked to either wear a 'onesie' or clothes received as a Christmas gift and a traditional game to play with friends.
- **Santes Dwynwen day** – Santes Dwynwen was celebrated at the end of January by wearing smart clothes, taking part in activities about Santes Dwynwen, decorating a heart shaped biscuit, making cards and having a Hidden Love game and a partners disco in the afternoon.
- **St David's Day** –A week of activities was held to celebrate Cwl Cymru Week. The pupils learnt playground game nursery rhymes, an Owain Glyndwr show was held, a special St David's Service was held and a parade around the village, talents show, scripting sessions with 3 actors from Rownd a Rownd, a story session with the librarian Nia Griffith and folk dancing sessions with Bethane Williams. Once again, the week was a huge success.

Presentation to the Governors- Council members gave a presentation to the Governors at the meeting held on March 22nd 2018.

Language Charter – Priorities were set for the year including analyzing Language Charter questionnaire results.

Pupils are rewarded in the weekly service for their readiness to use Welsh and listening to Welsh music and watching Welsh TV programmes at the school at breakfast time and playtimes in rainy weather.

The School Council organized a day of activities to celebrate Santes Dwynwen /St David's Day and World Book Day.

A week of activities was held to celebrate Cymru Cwl Week. The pupils learnt yard nursery rhymes, an Owain Glyndwr Show was held, a special St David's service was held, a talents show, scripting sessions with 3 actors from Rownd a Rownd, a story session with the librarian Nia Griffith and folk dancing sessions with Bethane Williams.

Ysgol Waunfawr Urdd Branch

52 pupils from year 2 to year 6 joined the Urdd.

A fortnightly activities evening was held and a diverse programme was arranged for the year such as Bingo evening ,decorating biscuits to celebrate Santes Dwynwen, a fun session at the Fun centre, hand work ,First Aid Training, ten pin bowling, a session at the Antur, film night and swimming at Bangor.

The branch competed at Eisteddfod Gyloch Arfon and gained success winning through to the Eryri County and National eisteddfod.

Free Breakfast Scheme

Over sixty pupils receive breakfast daily. Four of the school's ancillary staff prepare the breakfast from day to day. The club is held between 8.20 and 8.40 a.m. Since Easter 2018, a Look After Club is held between 8.00-8.20 a.m at 80p a day.

Healthy Plan

The school is committed to Gwynedd and Mon Schools Healthy Plan and have completed the second stage of the plan. We will starting on Stage 4 of the plan this year. It is noted in the Handbook that only fruit is allowed as a snack at play time. Sweets and fizzy drinks are banned.

William Mathias Scheme

35 pupils received instrumental lessons at the school from 3 stringed instrument and brass tutors under the William Mathias Scheme

6. ALN ARRANGEMENTS AND POLICIES

- The school has a designated policy and guidelines for ALN in compliance with Code of Practice requirements. The policy is annually reviewed.
- A register of pupils on stages is kept and pupil groups receive additional support from a Cognition and Learning Teacher who spends two mornings a week at the school. There is close collaboration with the County's Special Needs Department and the Specialist Agencies.
- Miss Sioned Hughes is the ALN Co-ordinator (Mrs Hannah Williams during Miss Hughes maternity leave) and Mrs Nia Williams is the designated Governor.

Procedures

- Pupils are assessed at the start of their education in the nursery class and a detailed record is kept of their development and progress via the class teacher and assistants continuous assessment.
- Early targeting occurs if it is observed that there are specific difficulties or delay in language development and communication.
- An assistant gives specific focus and provides early intervention for specific periods daily at the FP.
- At KS2- groups are purposefully targeted with the foundation skills assistant for 3 hours daily. Pupils are assessed following two terms consultation for more specialist support from the LEA.
- 8 annual ALN school Support + pupil reviews were held.
- Termly meetings were held with the Outside Agencies such as the Educational Psychologist/Language Difficulties Specialist Teachers/ Language Therapists/ The Justice Service/Social Services and Behaviour Specialist Teachers.

ALN Assistants

- There are 2 one to one ALN assistants at the school employed by the LEA 2017-8.
- Three assistants employed by the school have received Dyfal Donc and Language training to provide intervention for individual pupils who have Dyslexia problems.
- They have also received ELKLAN training for early intervention.

Visits from Outside Agencies

- Strategy meetings have been held with Social Services and termly meetings with the Gyda'n Gilydd Agency who work to support vulnerable families who have additional needs.
- The Cognition and Learning Teacher from the LEA assisted School Action Plus pupils two mornings a week throughout the year.
- Delyth Gibbard Communication and Interaction Specialist Teacher and Siwan Jones Assistant worked regularly during the term with an Autistic pupil.

- The psychologist Elenid Glyn assessed Dyslexia screening on 3 pupils.
- 5 SEN pupil reviews were held and there was effective co-operation with various agencies.
- The Language Therapist worked with 3 pupils who have Language Difficulties.
- Siwan Jones, Communication and Interaction Assistant worked with an Autistic pupil.
- The Cruise Agency that provides counselling for pupils to cope with family bereavement worked with a pupil.
- GW attended monthly meetings with Social Services during the year.

DISABLED PUPILS:

There is a suitable entrance and toilet for disabled pupils and it is ensured that disabled pupils are not discriminated against.

Equality:

- All pupils at Ysgol Waunfawr are treated equally based on personal objectives and development.
- It is ensured that no pupil suffers prejudice on grounds of language, age, gender, ability, religion, social background, illness or disability.
- Pupils are distributed to gender, language and mixed ability groups.
- The concept of equality is promoted in all aspects of school life (However, external competition rules that discriminate on gender grounds must be respected). Hopefully, through providing an equal opportunity for pupils, the value of each individual as a member of the community can be emphasized.

SAFETY

There are safety arrangements to follow at the school and they are reviewed by the Governors during the year.

Fire: Regular fire drills are held every half term. All staff participate in the fire drill and fire safety process. An outside agency carry out an annual inspection of the fire extinguishers. The emergency lights are regularly tested.

Entrances: The school entrances are protected. Admission to the school can be obtained through ringing a bell at the main entrance.

Buildings: The school buildings are annually inspected and the Headteacher monitors their safety from day to day, and the authorities are notified of any dangers.

Equipment: An outside agency holds an annual inspection of PE equipment. An outside agency holds an annual inspection of all electrical equipment.

First Aid: 3 staff members have received training and the qualification gained is re-accredited every three years.

Risk Assessments: These are completed as required, and a copy sent to the Education Authority. A substantial number has been prepared during the year to tie in with educational visits.

SPORTS

School PE Lessons:

- Nursery and Reception Class ¾ hour PE session a week.
- Y 1 and 2 = ¾ hour session of PE and swimming lesson ½ hour a week.
- Y 3- 6 = an hour session of PE and swimming/tennis or gymnastics lesson ½ hour a week.
- During Spring and Summer term, FP and KS2 pupils are encouraged to participate in Clwb Dal i Fynd – a scheme to encourage pupils to walk or run around the 100m track on the playground. Pupils receive a certificate in recognition of their efforts every 1km.

'Kick it' Scheme- Y 2 – Y 6 have an opportunity to attend football lessons for a 6 week period during the Autumn term. Around 34 pupils received lessons this year.

SPORTS The Sports day is organized during June. All pupils from the nursery to year 6 are divided into 3 teams: Tim Gwyrfai/ Cwellyn and Eilio. The teams elect 2 captains from year 6 and 2 vice-captains from Y6. Tim Eilio were this year's victors. Congratulations to the captains Gruff Llwyd and Elain from year 6.

Sports Winners 2018 – The school champions this year were Martha and Aled from year 5.

KS2 competed in the following competitions:

- During the Autumn term, the Netball team competed in the Arfon Schools Tournament.
- Y 6 received 4 day training to develop Gwynedd Scheme Level 1 and 2 cycling skills in June.
- The School Rugby Team competed at the Arfon Schools Rugby Tournament held at y Morfa at Caernarfon in October 2017 and won the competition.
- During Spring Term 2018, the Y6 athletics team won Arfon Schools Athletics Tournament coming fourth in Gwynedd Schools competition.
- The Swimming team won the Arfon Schools Gala competition.
- A cycling skills development day was held, led by Gwen from Sustrans Cymru. A cycle repair and scooter session was held and a day of skills training. The pupils participated in the 'Big Pedal' campaign by cycling and coming to school on a scooter for ten days. The school came seventh throughout Wales.
- A football match was held against Ysgol Dolbadarn at the end of June. These games are organized each term and pupils enjoy the friendlies between both schools.
- The pupils competed in the Urdd North Wales and County Cylch Athletics.
- Arfon Schools Tennis Tournament was held for years 3 /4/ 5/ 6 at y Ganolfan at Caernarfon at the end of June.
- Year 6 received their Swimming Curriculum Award Summer Term 2018.
- The Rugby Team came 1st at the Rugby Festival held at Morfa Bychan at the start of July 2018.
